

Erasmus+

Within the framework of the European Erasmus+ program, students of the Department (undergraduate, postgraduate, doctoral candidates, postdoctoral researchers) have the opportunity:

- A) to complete part of their studies at corresponding Departments of Universities abroad, with which the Department has signed bilateral agreements (see below), receiving a study grant, or
- B) to work in an organization (company, institution, institute, NGO, university, research center, etc.) related to their field of study, in any European country, receiving a traineeship grant.

The recognition of courses attended by students who move abroad for studies at the Host Institution is fully ensured and is carried out based on the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS).

For traineeships, there are no bilateral agreements specifying mobility destinations. Instead, students must find a host organization themselves and ensure acceptance for the desired period. Recent graduates may also participate in traineeships within the first year after graduation, provided they apply during their final year of studies and before obtaining their degree.

Calls for expressions of interest for student participation in study mobility and traineeships are usually published in March each year on the Department's website. They include information on participation requirements, selection criteria, funding amounts, and required documents.

The minimum duration of the mobility period is 3 months for studies and 2 months for traineeships, while the maximum duration, for either studies or traineeships, is 12 months per study cycle.

The grant covers a substantial part of the expenses abroad, and its amount is determined based on the cost of living in the host country of the student, according to the tables below:
